FORT VALLEY RIDES

Weather was glorious for the Fort Valley rides the weekend of October 28-29 – cool but pleasant on Friday, and much warmer and even more pleasant, for the humans at least, on Saturday. Both days featured both 30 and 50 mile rides, as well as 15 and 30 mile Ride and Ties, and, on Saturday, an intro ride for people who wanted to give endurance a try – some of whom had attended the Endurance 201 clinic organized by Karen Wade on Oct. 8.

On Friday, Lynne Gilbert on Mercuric, Sarah Fletcher on Denny Crane, and Trisha Juerling on Spencer Tracey finished in a three way tie for first place in the 50, while BC went to Lani Newcomb and Fougueux, who finished fourth. Forty-two teams started, and 35 finished.

The Friday 30 was won by Rebecca Bianchi, riding RAA's Marsh, while Dana Reeder on Flo was second and BC. Twenty-two horses started the ride, and 20 finished.

Ride manager Claire Godwin, who also served as ride secretary, found time to get her horse Serene Zeliza ready and finished the Saturday 50 in another three way tie for first, along with Lisa Delp on Wicked Breeze and Lisa Green on LR April Breeze. Serene Zeliza also won BC. Fortyone horses started the 50, and 33 finished.

Austin Shaffer, riding Fantastk IO+, was first to finish and BC in the Saturday 30. Nineteen horses started the 30, and all 19 finished – an incredible accomplishment.

Claire says she and husband Pete, who cooked all the delicious food everyone enjoyed over the weekend, think they have managed FV for nine years, which she says it is their "honor and pleasure" to do. She goes on: "I thought that the ride this year was the prettiest ever, and loved the weather. I worried that since it was later in October this year, it would be super cold, but it turned out to be the warmest FV ride ever. The leaves weren't quite peak yet, and again, that was surprising, but I guess it was due to the dry summer and warm fall. I was very thankful that Barb Horstmeier and Diane Connolly day managed for me on Saturday, so that I could ride. The trail conditions were very good, with John Proudman, Valerie Kanavy, and Jack Weber, as well as Andy Giordano and the motorcycle guys, spending hours on trail work over the weeks before the ride."

In the afternoon over half of them went out to ride some mock endurance trails despite a steady drizzle, with Nick Irianni and Kaitlyn Behr drag riding.

The stations were staffed by volunteer OD members and covered topics including Training and Conditioning (Barb Horstmeier), Trailering (Jack Weber), Tack and Equipment (Bob Walsh), Horse Camping (John Lyttle), Vet Check (Lani Newcomb), and Crewing (Nancy Smart and Joe Selden).
