Rainy weather didn't dampen spirits or completion rates at the October 24-25 Fort Valley Ride.

2008 Fort Valley Ride Report

he Fort Valley endurance rides were held on Friday and Saturday, October 24-25,

Using Fitchetts Field as basecamp enabled all of the vet checks to be held in camp. Despite heavy rain that set in Friday evening and lasted through Saturday, completion rates were very high for both days of the ride.

On Friday, 25 of 28 riders completed the 50 and all 12 LD riders successfully completed the 30 mile ride. On Saturday, a total of 47 riders braved the elements, with 23 completing the 50 and all but one of the 23 LD riders finishing the ride in great shape.

"At one point, rain was coming down so heavily that the rocky climb up Indian Graves spouted a large waterfall that really confused my horse," said 50-mile rider Jennifer Smith of Hayes, Virginia.

Tom Hutchinson came in first in the 50 miler on Friday and rode the same horse in the same time the second day (crossing in 5th place). He also won the Asgard filly Symmetrie in the OD raffle drawing held on Saturday night. Judie Ricci's gelding ISR Prince Shaval won Friday's High Vet Score and Dana Reeder on Charlie Brown received Best Condition. On Saturday, Gabe Van Arman on SL Dynamic was first to finish, Sandra Fretelliere's mare Mona Tiki PW received High Vet Score and Julia Bianchi on Lady Monalaina won Best Condition.

A total of 17 horse and rider teams who completed at Fort Valley also earned the Triple Crown Award for completing all three Old Dominionsponsored rides in the same year. Triple Crown winners, listed on page 2, will receive special awards at the December 13 Holiday Party. •

In Memory of GM Chagall 1989 - 2008

n November 5, Lynne Gilbert of Raphine, Virginia unexpectedly lost her beloved endurance horse and longtime friend, GM Chagall, possibly from an aneurism or burst tumor.

Well known to many Old Dominion members, Lynne and Chagall started their 13-year endurance career in 1994, completing 3,300 miles and 15 100 milers together, including six Old Dominion 100s.

They made the USA East Endurance Team in 2001 and 2003, but the highlight of Chagall's career was winning and receiving Best Condition at the Old Dominion 100 in 2002. Lynne accomplished this feat riding in the cavalry division, with no outside supplies or crewing assistance.

Lynne and Chagall also had the once-ina-lifetime experience of being invited to compete abroad together, successfully completing a 160 km endurance ride in Abu Dhabi the following year.

Tom Sites, who purchased Chagall and introduced him to the world of endurance, offered the following memories:

"Chagall came to me as a tall, gangly yearling and show cull, one of many, from Aries Arabians to a farm in Luray that a family member owned.

"He was raised in pasture in a herd that was handled weekly at best. At the end of his third year he showed promise and was sent to a trainer for 30 days. Ridden slowly through his 4th year, he went to the Fort Valley competitive ride in the fall when it was still held at Skyline Ranch outside Front Royal.

"Chagall did well and was strong and willing during the ride. At the end crossing some pavement he spooked but stood and I knew he was a good horse. Jeannie Waldron was there and said she wanted to buy this horse. I said...'Jeannie you're the only one in this world that would be able to buy him'".

"So Chagall went to Jeannie and her herd of horses and the multitude of friends she manages to find to ride all her horses. One of them, Lynne Gilbert, rode Chagall and fell in love with him. Jeannie, after seeing this love, sent Chagall to Lynne as her first horse and the rest is history.

"They were a team that is rare to see between horse and rider. After EPM and blindness in one eye and through Lynne's devotion to Chagall, he came back and the OD Cavalry/Win/BC will be his highest glory. Seeing them together that day was like magic. When it was just the two of them on the trail, I think they really found each other. Their bond was real and total and everlasting."
